Pro Tip: Explanations and statistics

tend to be used too often, whereas

the remaining types are not used often enough!



Listeners lose interest FAST unless you do something to GRAB & KEEP their attention

Just because an idea is clear to you does not mean it will be clear to your audience!

Listeners will rarely accept your statments without some kind of proof



Use a heartwarming story or startling statistic to stimulate audience Interest!

Use verbal supports to CLARIFY your content and reasoning!

Verbal supports serve as evidence and PROOF for the ideas presented in a speech!

- Use at least 2 different types of verbal support for each of your main points
- Always remember that without the supporting materials that add substance and flesh to your outline - your speech won't be very appealing to your audience!
